



COMPASS is our team-mentoring program developed by spouses for spouses. Available in many fleet concentration areas through in-person sessions or globally in a virtual format, the program spans 12 hours delivered over three days. Whether in-person or virtual, COMPASS aims to equip new Navy spouses with essential tools and information for navigating the challenges of sea service life. Any Navy spouse, new or seasoned, is welcome to attend at any time during their Navy journey. While the course content remains standardized across locations, each mentor contributes a unique perspective and insights specific to their team's area. COMPASS covers topics such as Naval History, customs and traditions, benefits and services, finances, moving, deployment, healthy communication, and exploring your community. CORE, our Continuum of Resources and Education program, delivers independent programming that encompasses localized events tailored to specific areas and global events through virtual courses or recorded content. Local teams support the FamilyLine mission by organizing and facilitating seminars, workshops, and presentations on topics of importance to sea service spouses. Virtual offerings have featured recorded sessions such as a three-part Mustang Spouse Symposium designed for spouses of newly commissioned officers with prior enlisted service, as well as an Emergency Preparedness webinar. The Naval Spouse Leadership Course is a Navy funded course offered to spouses of first time XO, CO, CMC, COB and Command Senior Chiefs en route to their first command tour. This class is held in Newport, Rhode Island. FamilyLine and its Naval Spouse Leadership Course Steering Committee works with the Naval Leadership and Ethics Command to provide mentors and tailor the course material to best support these Triad Spouses, in keeping with our "by spouses for spouses" legacy.
